

Three afternoons of silence, reflection, and teaching on the tender wisdom of Julian of Norwich, Teresa of Avila, and Hildegard of Bingen. The mystics of all traditions claim that their love-encounter with the Holy One defies all description and yet their experience of longing and union pours out in the form of ecstatic, luminous and richly descriptive poetry and prose. In this gathering, Mirabai shares selected passages from the great Christian mystics, Teresa of Avila, Julian of Norwich, and Hildegard of Bingen, engaging these evocative words as objects of Lectio Divina (sacred reading). She tells stories from their lives and offers her reflections on their essential wisdom teachings, paying special attention to their unique relevance for our times. After contemplative readings, along with meditations to support us, we can respond to evocative writing prompts to access our own words to deepen our personal journey.

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

They celebrate union with God and manifest love and compassion in action. Their writings give us inspiring poetry, visionary wisdom, prophetic insight, and guidance for bringing justice and mercy more fully into our world.

This e-course explores the life and teachings of some of the great mystics of the Christian tradition, revealing how their ancient — and sometimes recent — wisdom can inspire and transform our lives today. Each of the twelve emails we send will introduce you to a mystical teaching and invite you to savor its wisdom in the ordinary rhythms of your daily life.

You will meet both classical and contemporary mystics such as Hildegard of Bingen, Julian of Norwich, Teresa of Avila, Meister Eckhart, Howard Thurman, Aelred of Rievaulx, Evelyn Underhill, Dorothee Soelle, and several others. Over the course of our journey together we will consider the relationship between contemplation and action, the earth and the body as sacraments of Divine Presence, the breath as our guide to deep

meditation, personal touchstones, mantra prayer, the sorrowful mother, soul friends, the code of chivalry, healing the sacred wound, the mysticism of resistance, and more.

This e-course consists of 40 daily emails.

As a spiritual master, Thomas Merton (1915 - 1968) has proven to have real staying power. Each year new books are added to the ever-expanding library of his published works — prose and poetry, letters and journals, photographs and drawings, social criticism and cultural commentaries. Many of us return to his writings again and again, and new generations of seekers discover him every day. This extraordinary Trappist monk, writer, civil rights activist, and peacemaker processed all his reading and encounters with others through daily journals. He was a master of everyday spirituality, finding meaning and things to celebrate in everything he experienced. Merton was one of the first contemporary Christians to find a balance between contemplation and social action. He believed that they had to go hand-in-hand, making him a forerunner of the modern-day emphasis on spiritual activism. Merton was also a pioneer of what Wayne Teasdale has called "interspirituality." He explored and reveled in the bounties of Buddhism, Judaism, Sufism, Taoism, and Hinduism.
